

Signs of The Fae

In Irish folklore, the Fae, also called the Good Neighbors or the Sí (shee), are neutral beings with varying intentions towards humans. Practitioners often cite certain incidents as signs of their presence.

**Lost Objects**: Sometimes misplaced items aren't mere accidents; they might be spirited away by fairies, especially shiny ones like coins and jewelry.

**Duplicate Items**: Occasionally, missing objects mysteriously reappear, but when you go to put them back, you find duplicates already in place, seemingly materialized by the Fae.

Completed Chores: Like the helpful Brownies of folklore, some housebound fairies might tidy up loose ends for you, especially if they notice you're overwhelmed.

**Fairy Rings**: These mystical circles, formed by mushrooms or flowers, are said to be where fairies dance at night. Stepping into one or picking from it could lead you to the Fairy realm.

**Blooming Signs**: Finding flowers and mushrooms in unexpected places, like near your doorstep, could be a sign of fairies' travels, leaving their magical mark.

**Pet Behavior**: Pets may react strangely around fairies, showing signs of seeing or interacting with something invisible or exhibiting excitement or fear.

**Spoiled Food**: If your food spoils unusually quickly, fairies might have indulged themselves, leaving behind what remains after absorbing its nutrients.

Fleeting Presence: Catch glimpses of fairies as quick movements or shadows flitting from one room to another, disappearing before you can fully observe them.
